



From yacht charter to life in Croatia


What began as a simple tourist visit to Croatia evolved into a life-changing journey, where a memorable sailing experience led to a deep connection with the country and the creation of a successful business.

North Dalmatia



Sometimes overlooked as a holiday destination in favour of the more famous resorts and islands further along the coast, the North Dalmatian region has much to offer to its visitors. The area contains the beautiful coastal towns of Zadar, Šibenik and Primošten as well as numerous islands and three national parks.

The city of Zadar is unique for its thousand-year-old urban existence which makes it one of the oldest cities in Croatia. This is a city filled with cultural and historical heritage that can be seen just by walking through the city. Zadar is not too crowded, it's not overrun with tourists and its two unique attractions – the sound-

Matanovi dvori Rooms & Restaurant is known for its diverse menu and extensive wine list, offering an authentic taste of the region. Restaurant Francesco is a family-run restaurant with an elegant ambiance, providing a warm and truly homey din-



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



This unique combination of natural beauty, rich history and sea adventures makes the Kornati Islands the pinnacle of a Mediterranean dream. The Kornati labyrinth of rocky shores and untouched nature offers the perfect blend of adventure, culinary delights and a deep connection with nature. For sailors, the Kornati Islands are not just a destination - they are an experience that redefines the concept of freedom.

Breathtaking nature

The Kornati archipelago, called the 'crown of creation' by George Bernard Shaw, fascinates with its nakedness. The barren rocky slopes, built of limestone, create a contrast to the transparent sea, the blue of which can be seen even from space. Cliffs up to 80 meters high, such as those on Klobučar Island, protrude above the seabed that reaches depths of 100 meters. This geological dramaturgy is the result of millennia of erosion and tectonic shifts, creating a 'lunar land-scape' that intrigues artists and scientists.

Marine Phenomenon

With an impressive 2,700 hours of sunshine a year, the Kornati offer ideal sailing conditions from May to October. Whether you are an experienced sailor or a beginner, you will enjoy the perfect combination of favorable winds and sheltered bays here. And how could you

not enjoy it when it comes to a destination with crystal clear waters that provide exceptional visibility, creating perfect conditions for diving and observing marine life. - The surroundings of the island of Purar reveal the wrecks of Venetian galleys and German warships from World War II.
- For snorkeling, the Lojena Bay on Levrnak offers the archipelago's only sandy beach, where Periskas have embedded themselves in the sand.

From sea to table

Restaurants like Konoba Opat or Robinson in Vrulja lead the way in local tradition in gastronomic art. Lamb roasted under a peka (iron bell) is prepared for 6 hours with olive wood from the island of Žut, while squid is stuffed with olives from nearby groves. You can also enjoy various versions of brudet on the Kornati Islands.

View from the top

The climb to Metlina (237 m), the highest peak of the Kornati Islands, takes 40 minutes along steep paths surrounded by the ruins of Illyrian castles. The lookout reveals the geometry of the dry stone walls – 330 km of stone borders that the Kurnatari (the name for the local population) built over the centuries.


The first Sunday in July brings together hundreds of sailboats in Tarac Bay for the feast of Our Lady of Tarac. A sailor's procession, accompanied by a gusla, follows the relic of St. Nicholas through the canals – a fusion of faith and maritime tradition that UNESCO has declared an intangible cultural heritage.

Recipe

Lobster

in dalmatian buzara

Ingredients

Fresh lobster 1500 g (2 pieces, cut in half lengthwise)

Red onion 150 g (chopped)

Garlic 50 g (peeled, tightly pressed) White wine 200 ml

Olive oil 50 ml

Parsley 50 g (fi nely chopped before the end of cooking)

Homemade salad 200 ml

Fish soup 300 ml

Spaghetti 250 g (cook separately in boiling salted water)

Raisins 50 g Prose<u>cco 100 ml</u>

Preparation

Begin by sautéing red onion and garlic in medium-heated olive oil until they turn golden. Once they're nicely browned, pour in some white wine and let it simmer gently. Add your homemade salsa and bring the mixture to a boil. Next, add the lobster, which should be cut in half, and cook over low heat until the lobster meat is just medium-cooked. Season the dish with salt and pepper, then add the cooked spaghetti, allowing it to cook for a few more minutes to ensure the pasta absorbs the flavours of the sauce. Just before finishing, pour in Dalmatian Prošek and let the dish boil over high heat for up to two minutes.

To finish, drizzle with olive oil, sprinkle with freshly chopped parsley, and serve. It's recommended not to stir the dish with a food processor but to shake it by hand frequently to keep the lobsters intact.

Recipe Spaghetti with mussels

Ingredients

250 g spaghetti

20-30 mussels

4 pieces of garlic

5 cherry tomatoes 1 dL white wine

Peppe

1 smaller chili pepper

2 spoons olive oil

1 spoon capers

2 dL whey

Boil spaghetti in salted water and dry when boiled. Put mussels in the pot and steam them in closed pot so that they discard their shell. Save the water where you steamed the mussels and put it aside. Put the chopped (or squished) garlic in a frying pan and fry on olive oil for a few moments. Add chopped cherry tomatoes and stir for a minute. Add your white wine, whey and the mussel liquid you've saved before. Put a pinch of milled pepper to spice it up a bit. Add a little chili pepper and capers. You should cook altogether until the liquid reduces when you should add your spaghetti and cook altogether for one more minute. Leave few mussel shells for decoration and before you put your dish on a plate- add mussels. Simple and delicious dish is ready for consuming! Enjoy!

Authentic taste of Dalmatia's flavors



Rooted in Mediterranean tradition, Dalmatian cuisine showcases the richness of local ingredients and time-honored techniques. Each dish carries a story of heritage, with recipes passed down for centuries, preserving the authentic flavors of the region.

Dalmatian cuisine, based on Mediterranean traditions, combines the simplicity of ingredients with cultural roots, and flavours are shaped through unique preparation techniques and the use of indigenous ingredients. Recipes have been passed down from generation to generation for centuries, and each delicacy is a story in itself. Their names are often difficult to pronounce but easy to eat. Enjoy your meal!

Brački vitalac

A protected speciality of the island of Brač, it is prepared from lamb or goat offal. This meat speciality originates from shepherding traditions where nothing was wasted, and every part of the animal was used. Today, it is prepared in villages such as Murvica and Nerežišća, and the Vitalac Festival is held every July in Postira.

Hrapačuša

Hrapačuša is a traditional cake from the island of Brač that has become a protected intangible cultural asset of the Republic of Croatia. It originates from the town of Dol on Brač and is named after the rough Dol stone that it resembles in appearance. Although it consists of basic ingredients such as flour, eggs, almonds, walnuts and 'prošek' (a traditional alcoholic drink made from wine), its taste is very impressive.

Skradinski rižot

If you are wondering what the slowest food in Croatia is, the answer is Skradinski risotto, which takes 13 hours to prepare. It is based on veal belly that is cooked for 8 hours with red onion, after which rice is added. The key technique is continuously stirring it with a wooden spoon (paddle) to prevent the starch from settling.

Soparnik

Soparnik, protected as an intangible cultural heritage by UNESCO, consists of two thin layers of dough with a filling of Swiss chard, parsley and garlic. It is traditionally baked in a stone oven where the temperature of 300°C achieves the perfect balance between crispy dough and juicy filling.

Brujet

This dish of many names (brujet, brudet, or brodet) is one Dalmatian classic you'll likely enjoy on an island, at a family-run 'konoba', from a pot as big as the wooden table it sits atop. A traditional stew that uses three types of the freshest fish you catch that day is given life thanks to olive oil, garlic, and onions, with tomatoes and white wine as an acidic flavour enhancer to complete this seafood delicacy. Brujet is usually served over a bed of polenta, which soaks the stew



into each granule, allowing for an aromatic edible experience you'll be hard-pressed to find on any other sailing holiday.

Viška pogača

A savory cake with anchovies and capers, it is a descendant of the Roman 'panis nauticus'. In the village of Komiža on island Vis, the dough is still kneaded and baked in stone ovens from the 13th century.

Rožata

Tasty cream made of eggs, milk and caramel is created through the phenomenon of 'shock cooling'. After baking at 180°C, it is immediately placed in the refrigerator at -4°C, which ensures a soft, creamy interior and intensifies the flavours.



A Guide to the wine pearls of the Mediterranean

Did you know that Croatia has more than 130 indigenous grape varieties? An astounding fact that many travellers don't know. And the best part? As you sail the coast of Croatia, you can see the patchwork of vineyards on the islands, and visit many unique wineries along the way.

Every bottle of island wine you open is a dialogue between the past and the future, and wine tastings are a spectacle for all senses. Indulge in the chronicle of the Mediterranean spirit - from the volcanic terroirs of Vis to the solar vineyards of Solta - written in every drop of wine. The Croatian islands, dotted with vineyards that slide down sundrenched slopes, represent a rich history of Mediterranean viticulture. From indigenous varieties preserved for centuries to innovative enological approaches, these Croatian islands wineries offer a journey through flavours that are 'created' by stone, sea and the passion of local winemakers. This guide reveals the most famous wine destinations in the Adriatic, where every glass of wine turns into a story about the identity of the island.

HVAR Tomić Winery

In the heart of the Hvar vineyards, Tomić Winery combines Greek vinification methods with the most modern technologies. Andro Tomić, the first Hvar native to earn a Bordeaux degree in oenology, has revitalized forgotten varieties like Bogdanuša and Prča. His Pošip Grand Selection, aged for 18 months in French oak barrels, has achieved iconic status, with a mineral note that reflects the limestone soil of Jelsa. In a cellar modelled after Diocletian's Palace, tastings are accompanied by hologram displays of the maturation process.

Zlatan Otok

On the southern slopes of Hvar, where vineyards slope down to the blue, Zlatan Plenković creates a Plavac Mali with 16% alcohol that retains its elegance thanks to night harvesting. Their 'Crna perla', a cuvée made from grapes from over 100-year-old vines, is fermented in amphorae buried in the seabed, absorbing the rhythm of the tides.

KORČULA

Black Island Winery

In a revitalized tobacco factory in Smokvica, young oenologists use high-frequency sonication to extract aromas. Their Pošip 'Pearl of Sand', obtained by cryogenically grinding grapes at -196°C, has achieved cult status among sommeliers. During 'night tastings', visitors explore the aromas with the help of night glasses.

Zure

The Batistić-Zure winery has nurtured, valued and produced the indigenous Grk grape variety from the sandy soils of Lumbarda for over 600 years, and today, their modern vineyard has approximately 33,000 vines. The winery, in addition to the Grk 'Bartul' and Sur Lie, produces wines from Pošip, Plavac Mali, and 'Rebellion' (a blend of five red varieties – Cabernet Sauvignon, Merlot, Syrah, Plavac Mali, and Alicante Bouschet).

BRAC

Stina Winery

On the Bol waterfront, a winery housed in a former quarry commune has transformed Brač's geological diversity into a wine palette. Their Plavac mali 'Majstor' is made from grapes from three different micro-locations: volcanic soil in Bol, chalky soil in Škrip, and shale in Sutivan. The tasting set includes rock samples for a tactile connection to the terroir.

Senjković Wines

If you moor in Milna, Sutivan or Supetar, it is only a 15 – 20 min taxi drive to Senjković Winery. The Winery is run with a passion for wine and gastronomy and the guests are delighted with culinary delicacy matched to the wines. Set in a darling stone house and courtyard, this is a unique and intimate experience that lovers of food, wine, and tradition won't want to miss...

VIS

Lipanović Winery

In tunnels built for the needs of the former Yugoslav Navy, the wines maintain a constant temperature of 13°C. Their Vugava 'Atlantida' ages 30 meters deep in special hydrothermal chambers, absorbing underwater vibrations. Tastings are accompanied by holographic projections of the island's history.

Senjanović Wines

On fields covered in volcanic ash, this winery uses geothermal energy to heat its cellars. Their Plavac mali 'Eruption' has a unique mineral structure, with notes that vary depending on the activity of the underwater volcanoes near Komiža.

PELJESAC

Grgić Winery

Grgić is a name synonymous with wine-making. Mike Grgich is the legendary Napa Valley winemaker behind the 1973 Chateau Montelena Chardonnay; this is the wine which bested several white Burgundy wines in a blind tasting – which was later dubbed 'The Judgement of Paris'. In 1996, Mike moved back to Croatia and established Grgić wines and together with his daughter and nephew, started producing fine wines from Dalmatian grapes. Grgić Pošip (white) and Grgić Plavac Mali (red) are known worldwide and feature on the wine lists of many prestigious restaurants.

Korta Katarina

Villa Korta Katarina and Winery is unlike any other property in Croatia. Korta Katarina Villas are a member of the prestigious Relais & Châteaux, so the property, service, and attention to detail are unparalleled. 





Separate the degradable waste from plastics! In the marina there are always designated containers for recycling, so put them to good use!







BURA

TRAMONTANA

Bura's much friendlier sister is the transitional tramontana, a northerly wind that arrives to let us know that brother bura is on his way. Sailors use it to reach speeds up to 25 knots.

MAESTRAL

A wind that dances between the sun and the sea, maestral is most common in July and August, with steady blows known to help break the summer heat. Maestral promises smooth sailing.
